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
Bible prophecy reveals that earth's history will soon close with the visible return of Jesus Christ as King to claim all who have accepted Him as the world's only Redeemer and their Lord.

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"One thing have I desired of the Lord, that will I seek after; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord, and to inquire in His temple." Psalm. 27:4.

This was not only a Psalm of David, but also his wish and will, the beating of his soul. These words explain to us that he deeply loved the Lord. He always had a close relationship with Him. We can find an example of his great love for the Lord in Psalm 119:164, "Seven times a day do I praise thee, because of thy righteous judgments."

My dear brethren, how many people feel like king David? Search your mind and your heart and ask yourself. Do we have a close relationship with the Lord God, like David did? How many times do we worship the Lord each day? Do you understand this question? How long are we going to waste our time and our life?

The Bible says that the desire of David is: "For a day in thy courts is better than a thousand. I had rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than to dwell in the tents of wickedness." Psalm 84:10. "But as for me, I will come into thy house in the

multitude of thy mercy: and in thy fear will I worship toward thy holy temple." Psalm 5:7.

We have a proverb in the Tamil language which says, "don't dwell in the village, if there is no temple." So, the meaning of this is, the temple is the first house for the people wherever they dwell. It means that the people must worship the Lord. How did the Lord God explain to mankind regarding the method of worship?

Eden was the First Church for Mankind

As we know, our first parents Adam and Eve were created by God on the sixth day of the first week. Their first night was the start of the Holy Sabbath. There was no sin. Before sin entered into this world only two members of the church worshipped the Lord. Think on how cheerful and wonderful an experience this must have been. The first Sabbath observance of Adam in his life in Eden is inexpressible in words. The first sunset in his life was the first opening of the Sabbath in Eden. Man was created on the day of preparation that was the day before the holy Sabbath. On the first holy Sabbath day on this earth in the life of Adam, he

observed it along with his Creator and the heavenly angels with a heart full of joy. Think, dear brethren of the privilege of such wonderful blessings from God.

There was no separate church building; the Garden of Eden, the open place of nature was their wonderful church. It was the happiest and most joyful church because the great Creator Jesus was with them as the Church. There was no taint of sin.

When sin entered into the lives of our first parents Adam and Eve, they lost their everlasting life and face-to-face communication with the heavenly hosts, and their Creator Jesus Christ and the church of God in the Garden of Eden.

After sin entered into this world, the method of worship changed for mankind. They started to give offerings that required the shedding of blood for redemption from sin.

Sacrificial Offerings

When anyone committed a sin, sacrificial offerings were to take place before God as instructed by God for redemption from sin. This would continue until the death of Jesus Christ on the cross on behalf of mankind. Jesus Christ is, "the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." John 1:29. The cruel sacrifice of animals witnessed by the sinner made him realize the awfulness of sin, and decide that he would never commit sin in his life here after. Man sacrificed animals without knowing the reason for the

sacrifice. So, this animal offering was of no use to man to set him free from sin because without the shedding of the blood of Jesus Christ there is no redemption for mankind.


So, we can understand that these sacrificial offerings were offered temporarily until the death of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Worship in the Sanctuary

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying "And let them make me a sanctuary; that I may dwell among them." Exodus 25:8 Here the people of Israel offered their sacrificial offerings to the Lord according to the word of God. "Now this is that which thou shalt offer on the altar; two lambs of the first year day by day continually. One lamb thou shalt offer in the morning; and the other lamb thou shalt offer at even." Exodus 29:38, 39. In the time of the Old Testament this animal sacrificial system of offerings were followed by our forefathers, Noah, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the people of Israel, judges, kings and prophets.

liberality in bringing their free-will offerings to Moses are recorded for the benefit of the people of God. Their example in preparing material for the tabernacle so cheerfully is an example for all who truly love the worship of God. Those who prize the blessing of God's sacred presence, when preparing a building that He may meet with them, should manifest greater interest and zeal in the sacred work in proportion as they value their heavenly blessings higher than their earthly comforts. They should realize that they are preparing a house for God." – The story of Redemption, pp. 152, 153.

Apostle Paul wrote to us, "For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins. Wherefore, when he cometh into the world, He saith, Sacrifice and offerings thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me: In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin thou hast had no pleasure. Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me) to do thy will, O God." Hebrews 10:4-7.



Sacrificial Offering of Jesus Christ

Even that there was no redemption for man from sin, these sacrificial offerings of animals continued unto the death of Jesus Christ. Those who offered the animals waited for the coming of Christ to offer Himself as the sacrificial offering; His blood for the real redemption of man. Now here, according to the expectation of all sinners. Jesus Christ came into this world for man. He suffered much torture, was cruelly crucified on Calvary, He shed His blood, died and was buried and then resurrected victoriously in the breaking of the sepulcher. Hereafter there is no offering necessary for the redemption of man; and with this, all the sacrificial offerings were finished with the sacrificial offering of Jesus Christ. "The Messiah, which is... the Christ." John 1:14 "The Messiah shall be cut off... And He shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease..." Daniel 9:26, 27.

Solomon Built the House of the Lord

From the time of Adam and Eve, people worshipped the Lord at altars, and the sanctuary with bloodshed offerings. They didn't have a permanent place of worship. King David tried to make a permanent house for the Lord. "That the king (David) said unto Nathan the prophet, See now, I dwell in an house of cedar, but the ark of God dwelleth within curtains. But our loving Lord replied to him, when thy days be fulfilled, and thou shalt sleep with thy fathers, I will set up thy seed after thee, which shall proceed out of thy bowels, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build an house for My name..." 2 Samuel 7:2, 12, 13.

David Gathered Materials for the Church

"With deepest interest the king (David) had gathered the rich material for building and beautifying the temple. He had composed the glorious anthems that in afteryears should echo through its courts. Now his heart was made glad in God, as the chief of the fathers and the princes of Israel so nobly responded to his appeal, and offered themselves to the important work before them. And as they gave their service, they were disposed to do more. They swelled the

offerings, giving of their own possessions into the treasury. David had felt deeply his own unworthiness in gathering the material for the house of God, and the expression of loyalty in the ready response of the nobles of his kingdom, as with willing hearts they dedicated their treasures to Jehovah and devoted themselves to His service. filled him with joy. But it was God alone who had imparted this disposition to His people. He, not man, must be glorified. It was He who had provided the people with the riches of earth, and His Spirit had made them willing to bring their precious things for the temple. It was all of the Lord; if His love had not moved upon the hearts of the people, the king's efforts would have been vain, and the temple would never have been erected." PP, pp. 752, 753.

According to the will of God, King Solomon began to build the house of the Lord. When he started the construction, he said, "And it was in the heart of David my father to build an house of the Lord God of Israel. And the Lord said unto David my father, whereas it was in thine heart to build an house unto my name, thou didst well that it was in thine heart. Nevertheless thou shalt not build the house; but thy son that shall come forth out of thy loins, he shall build the house unto my name. So the Lord hath performed his word which he spake; for I am risen up in the room of David my father. and sit on the throne of Israel, as the Lord promised; and have built an house for the name of the Lord God of Israel." 1 Kings 8:17-20; 1 Chronicles 17:4 - 12.

From the time of King Solomon, the people of Israel went to Jerusalem yearly to worship the Lord. This took place until the period of the disciples of Jesus Christ. After that the people worshipped the Lord everywhere.

The Voice of the Prophet about Church Buildings

King Solomon built a wonderful church to the Lord. Yet he said about the church, "But will God indeed dwell on the earth? behold the heaven and heaven of heavens cannot contain thee; how much less this house that I have builded?" 1 Kings 8:27. We read in the book of Acts about the church building. "But Solomon built him an house. Howbeit, the most High dwelleth not in temples made with hands; as saith the prophet; Heaven is my throne, and earth is my footstool: what

house will ye build me? saith the Lord, or what is the place of my rest? Hath not my hand made all these things?" Acts 7:47 – 50; Isaiah 66: 1, 2.

"...and this house, which I have hallowed for my name will I cast out of my sight." 1 Kings 9:7. "Thus saith the Lord of hosts... the mountain of the house as the high places of the forest." Jeremiah 26:18; Micah 3: 12.

Jesus said about the church building, "And Jesus said unto them, "See ye not all these things? Verily I say unto you, there shall not be left here one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down." Matthew 24:2.

You are the Temple of God

Every year the people of Israel went to the church at Jerusalem to worship the Lord God. But now the Lord God comes to the church within us. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me." Rev. 3:20. Why does the Lord God knock at the door of our heart? Apostle Paul replies to this question. "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are." 1 Corinthians 3: 16,17.

My dear brethren, according to the word of God, we, our soul, body and spirit are the temple of God. So we have to keep clean, holy and perfect, the temple of God. Why? We do not belong to ourselves, but we solely belong to God. 

Jesus spoke of wise and foolish virgins. Both were in the church of God. Both did pray, sing and read the Bible. Then in the end, the wise will enter in but the foolish will remain outside, unsaved. Yet they did not look very different from the wise ones. They both fulfilled the conditions required to remain in the church membership. But something was neglected by the foolish virgins, and therefore they had no oil and their lamps went out. They lost the Holy Spirit, and fell into darkness.

What was the cause of their foolishness? People have asked questions, "If I eat a little meat sometimes will I be lost?" "If I do not attend church meetings, will I be lost?" "If I do not pay tithes will I be lost?" And many similar questions people ask, thinking that small deviations from the truth do not take their salvation away.

But Jesus said, He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much." Like 14:10

The first sin committed by man was to eat the forbidden fruit. The next sin recorded was a murder. One sin committed leads to a next greater sin. Therefore it is foolishness to commit even the smallest sins.

A young man came to Canada from Europe some 40 years ago. He started working very hard. When others had vacations, holidays and parties, he just worked. He looked on these people as foolish, when they could have made money instead of enjoying holidays.

Soon after he started his own business and with hard work he was successful. A little later he started a second factory and eventually a third one. He often talked about his retirement, all that he would do with his money that he had accumulated. Then one day after a full day's work in the office he went to bed and never woke up. He passed away during his sleep. Was he wise or foolish?

He had no time for God, no time to go to church and very little did he enjoy the money that he had made. Jesus spoke a parable of a rich man whose ground brought a plentiful harvest. "I will say to my soul, Soul thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry. But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided? So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." Luke 12: 19-21.

Many people look up to these successful millionaires, admiring them and wishing to be like them, and even envying them. This also is foolishness. True happiness is not gained by riches.

There is another class of people that are called fools in the Bible. "The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God." Ps. 14:1.

There is enough evidence for the existence of God for everyone to believe. But these people do not want God. They want to be a god to themselves. To acknowledge God means to be accountable to Him and to render obedience to Him.

Even of those who believe that there is God, very few of them want to be His friend. When Jesus was upon the earth He was often alone. His own church rejected Him. Even His disciples left Him alone in time of danger. He had very few true friends.

When He suffered in the hands of evil men, there was nobody to wipe the blood and sweat from His forehead, or to offer a cup of water to Him. No one spoke a sympathetic word to Him when the sins of the world were pressing upon Him.

It was a custom in the Roman army that anyone to be crucified was first scourged. This flogging was done by an instrument of 4 or 5 chains attached to a wooden handle and in the end of each chain there was a _" diameter lead ball with iron spikes sticking out of it. This flogging tore the skin and muscles, causing much bleeding. Then the criminal had to carry his cross to the

place of execution, where he was stripped of his clothes and nailed to the cross with iron spikes.

This was the most severe, horrible, and shameful form of execution and at the same time listening to the ridicule and derision of the public.

He who created the whole universe, every star and planet, came to this world to suffer such a cruel and shameful death in the hands of evil men, filled with satanic spirit and hatred towards Him.

Now the way was opened for man to return to the favour of God and to become His sons and daughters and to inherit eternal life.

Yet how little do men value the salvation purchase with such a high price. How few are willing to become His followers.

This is the greatest foolishness that anyone can do, to turn away from Jesus and to despise His great sacrifice. The anger of God will be aroused towards them, towards people who think that the offer of Satan is better than the offer of God.

The half-hearted efforts by many professed Christians are not acceptable to God either. Their money is too precious to be spent for Jesus. Their time is too valuable for Him. They are too busy to work for Him. Are these Christians worthy of Jesus? No, never.

"Because that, when they knew God, they glorified Him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened. Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools." Rom. 1:21, 22.

Many Christians have fallen into this condition. They are lukewarm Christians and therefore in a lost condition.

Human wisdom is foolishness before God. The man with one talent was foolish and many are like him. The rich young man was foolish also, and millions follow his example.



In the time of Noah very few had the wisdom to save themselves. Almost the whole world perished because of their foolishness. And so it will be at the end of the world also.

It is foolishness to think that we gain by sin. Judas thought that he will gain by his betrayal. But he lost all. Balaam thought that he will gain, but he also lost it all. Ananias and Sapphira thought that they will gain by their lie, but they lost it all.

Solomon gives us advice in this regard, "Better is the poor that walketh in his integrity, than he that is perverse in his lips, and is a fool." Prov. 19:1.

There is no happiness in any sinful practice. "Fools because of their transgression, and because of their iniquities, are afflicted." Ps. 107:17. And this affliction will come upon every sinner.

Now let us look into wisdom. "OI how I love Thy law! it is my meditation all the day. Thou through Thy commandments hast made me wiser than mine enemies: for they are ever with me. I have more

understanding than all my teachers: for Thy testimonies are my meditation. I understand more than the ancients, because I keep Thy precepts." Ps. 119: 97-100.

"And unto man he said, "Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding." Job 28:28.

"How much better is it to get wisdom than gold! and to get understanding rather to be chosen than silver." Prov. 16:16.

Soon the shaking and separation will take place between the wise and foolish virgins. Then it will be too late to gain wisdom. Today is the time to learn wisdom and to do deep heart searching, and examine ourselves carefully. The deceptions of Satan are many and those who are caught in them do not realize their foolishness, but consider themselves wise.

May the Lord help us to open our eyes and see what we may be lacking yet and what duty we may

have neglected. Let us make our calling and election sure that not one of us will fail in the end. *AMEN*.

Ready?

Do you believe in the second coming of Jesus Christ? "Act as though you really believe?" (5T266). If you do, how are you preparing for it? What preparations are you pursuing, in your mind and heart? Are you diligently watching for the subtle, hopeful signs? Do you believe, like so many believers today, that He is coming soon? In retrospect, if someone were to say 20, 10 or even 5 years ago, that Jesus was coming soon, what would have been your answer then?

For some, most probably the answer may have been, no, not yet! Today, however, many might say, "but, the signs are obviously there, symbolically fulfilling prophecy, and furthermore, the Scriptures verify this repeatedly, such as, Rev 22:12, "And behold, I come quickly, and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be." "From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent; for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Mat 4:17). Moreover, "people need to be warned and roused to prepare, and not make any presumptuous and careless delays." (TM 238; Ev 217; GC 10).

DNA

Well, before proceeding further, this is not just another paper (or sermon), on the second coming of Jesus. You have heard many, and, rightly so, are still hearing them; "there's a need for more discourses on the doctrine of the second advent of Jesus." (Ev 22). But, I believe we can agree on what the Scriptures say of the last generations, that we are the last generation, and what a generation! Or, rather generations: "evil" (Deut. 1:35); "perverse and crooked" (Deut. 32:5, 20); "that curses" (Prov. 30:11); "vipers" (Luke 3:7); "rejecting Jesus" (Luke 17:25) (Jesus, here, was also foretelling His second coming)! Elsewhere it speaks of a "degenerative" generation, and so on.

Light Bearers

Yet, in spite of this, "the church has a special truth and work in every generation." (COL 78); and, moreover, "the churches of this generation are exalted to the highest privileges." (COL 317) Furthermore, the Scriptures add, "but you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light, who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy." (2 Pet. 2:9)

Who's Who?

The question arises; are we a part of those, as of the ancient Israelites that rejected Jesus in the Old Testament? Or, the Israelites of today that accept Jesus as their Saviour, and Master? Or, the Israelites of the New Testament that are "absorbed in ambitious strife for place and power among men?" (GC 313). Or, those "that are made depositaries of the sacred truth?" (DA 819) Or, of those striving for, "exclusiveness of the Christian toward Gentiles?" (SR 303-04) This requires some "heart-work" for the answers, "search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my thoughts." (Ps. 139:23; Lam. 3:40; Rom. 8:27). Also, "examine yourself whether you are in the faith." (2Cor. 13:5)

The Sealed

For we know also, that as we approach the end and before the second coming of Jesus, that "apostasy will increase." (Ev 363), and "be surprised at nothing in line of apostasy." (SM147). Apostasy, "falling

away", is the act of professed Christians who deliberately reject revealed truth. Apostasy differs from error concerning truth, which may be the result of ignorance (Acts 19:1-6), or heresy, which may be due to the snare of Satan (2 Tim. 2:25-26). Apostasy in the church, as in Israel (Isa. 1:5-6; 5:5-7) is irremediable and awaits judgment (2 Thess. 2:10-12; 2 Pet. 2:17, 21: Jude 11-15).

So, are we of the ancient Israelites or those of the 144,000? "Saying, hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the tree, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads, and I heard the number of them which were sealed; and there were sealed an hundred and forty and four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel." (Rev. 7:3).

Signs

What is an explicitly clear sign that we are, in fact, living in the end times? We search the Scriptures for this and find the predicted apostasy, "This know, also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God, having a form of godliness, but denying the power of it; from such turn away." (2 Tim. 3:1-5).

When?

The disciples believed that Jesus Christ was coming in their time. The apostle Paul believed the same. The martyrs in the Reform era, all who lifted up their voices for Jesus Christ, believed also Jesus was coming in their time. "Martin Luther expected the second advent of Jesus within 300 years." (GC 303). The Adventist Millerites expected Jesus to return in 1843. We can clearly see He did not, however, come as expected. But we can now distinctly see that He is coming soon, however, it's "apparently extended and delayed." (4T306;DA 633-34) His "exact time of coming is a mystery." (DA 633)

Stray Sheep

For many of the Millerite Adventists, and the nominal (not Sabbath keepers) group, confusion arose, disappointments came, error was introduced, the sanctuary truth was rejected, dissensions and divisions arose, fanaticism, and faith in the Advent movement was renounced. (EW 68-9;250; 256-57; GC 409, 456). They were sheep without the Shepherd. Yet, there were honest children of God, and precious jewels among them. (EW 69, 261)

New Hope

I can suggest why many lost hope then and are losing hope today. It's due to the fact that the foundation of hope was on the "event" instead of on the person of Jesus Christ. If it is on the person of Jesus we need to know who He is first; where He is and what He is doing. It is all tied in with the sanctuary truth; a pillar of belief.

In whom and what event are they placing their faltering and lingering hope? Is the hope on Jesus Christ, the Saviour and King? If their feeble hope is the event – the second coming of Jesus Christ – and this is their foundation, then their hope is based also on the "signs" of His coming. In other words, their hope is based only on any one or more of the signs! What if the signs come and go? (and there are many) What happens then to our hope? Where is the promise of His coming?

Whispered Promises

"And saying, where is the promise of His coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation." (2 Pet. 3:4) I have heard of His coming for years, and continue to hear it even more fervently today. Jesus did not come as expected. I remember very distinctly two early pioneers in the truth; both devout, true believers brought up in Europe, by ardent, firm Adventist parents. As very small children they were taught that Jesus was soon coming and to discontinue their schooling. They both recently died well into their eighties, always maintaining that expectant hope of His coming.

Therefore, Focus on Jesus Christ! The attention is not on Jesus Christ. What else? Focus on the promises! Heartfelt, unbreakable promises, whispered to you by the Holy Spirit, and fulfilled daily in your life – no matter what the signs reveal. Receive the daily blessings; protection, confidence, peace, joy, we so often overlook. "For bodily exercise profiteth little, but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come." (1 Tim 4:8) You see, godliness is a profitable investment!

Understand that it is He, Jesus Christ, who dwells in our foundation. Hope in Jesus Christ for His promises – and claim them! This is the hope of the faithful and God's final triumph, saying, "The Lord looks down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there are any who understand, who seek God." (Ps. 14:2).

Turning Point

So, what does it take to shift from the place, the event, to Jesus Christ? What does it take? Well, it takes the work of the Holy Spirit, saying, "However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and he will tell you things to come." (John 16:13)

You see, the Holy Spirit guides and shifts the hope on Jesus Christ! But, for many the Holy Spirit is lacking.

A conversation took place between a man and Jesus Christ. It was with Nicodemus, the ruler of the Jews. "Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." (John 3:5)


New Birth

Notice the marvelous shift here, reading into the heart of Nicodemus by Jesus Christ. The shift is now to the Son of God. "Nicodemus answered and said to Him, "How can these things be?" Furthermore, "Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" (John 3:4)

Notice here, again, not born of water, but by the Spirit of Jesus Christ. Baptism is often spoken of, experienced, and witnessed, but no mention of just a water baptism, as an embryo in a membranous sac. The emphasis is on a Spirit-filled life, not water only. This allows us to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. What is the Kingdom of God? "For the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy spirit." (Rom. 14:17)

To be sure, focus not on the event of the second coming of Jesus Christ but on Jesus Christ! *AMEN*.

In the September 2004 edition of the Signs of the Times an article appears entitled "Armageddon and the Middle East crisis." From this article we read the following:

Revelation indicates that the issues in earth's final war will be global, not local. And the issues (and combatants) will be spiritual, not political as they are at present in the Middle East. The battle of Armageddon will pit the nations of the world against the armies of heaven.

Revelation 13 says that the second beast will use false miracles to deceive the inhabitants of the world (verse 14). It is possible that one such deception will be a counterfeit battle of Armageddon; after all, the spirits of demons will gather the entire world to this battle (16:12-14).

In this respect the Bible gives two important details that can prevent us from being deceived. According to popular Christian culture, Armageddon finds the nations of the world taking sides against each other, arrayed in battle on a dusty Palestinian plain.

In Revelation, on the other hand, the nations of the world assemble to make war against Christ, not against each other. Moreover, it appears that virtually all nations participate. So, no matter how terrifying a world war in the Middle East may be, if the nations of earth are fighting each other, that war is not the biblical Armageddon. {Signs of the Times, September 2004}

In the Signs of the Times article Armageddon is presented as a spiritual battle that takes place at the end of the world. After reading it one is left with the impression that any literal wars at the end of the world are only side issues or deceptions. However are we, as the people of God, to ignore any literal wars at the end of the world as deceptions?

In the Signs of the Times article Armageddon is called "the sixth in a series of seven plagues." Indeed the seven last plagues come at end of the world. At the very same time, at the end of the world, the four winds are let loose (see Revelation 7:1). Therefore, Armageddon, the sixth plague (according to the Signs of the Times) comes at the very time the four winds are let loose. The following two statements show this:

The nations are now getting angry, but when our High Priest has finished His work in the sanctuary, He will stand up, put on the garments of vengeance, and then the seven last plagues will be poured out. {EW 36.1} I saw that the four angels would hold the four winds until Jesus' work was done in the sanctuary, and then will come the seven last plagues. {EW 36.2}

Soon He will say to the angels who are holding the four winds, "Let the plagues loose; let darkness, destruction, and death come upon the transgressors of my law." {RH, October 8, 1901 par. 15}

Read carefully Early Writings page 36 above quoted. It says two things 1) when Jesus' sanctuary work is finished then the seven last plagues will fall and 2) when Jesus' sanctuary work is done then the four winds will be released (no longer held). So when the sanctuary work is over, both these things occur. Thus the seven last plagues and the four winds are either one and the same thing, or at the very least they are concurrent events.

But what do the four winds represent? The four winds represent both the elements of nature gone awry, and political strife and war.

If such scenes as this are to come, such tremendous judgments on a guilty world, where will be the refuge for God's people? How will they be sheltered until the indignation be overpast? John sees the elements of nature--earthquake, tempest, and political strife-- represented as being held by four angels. These winds are under control until God gives the word to let them go. {TM 444.3}

Then I saw the four Angels cease to hold the four winds. And I saw famine, pestilence and sword, nation rose against nation, and the whole world was in confusion. {DS, March 14, 1846 par. 2}

So obviously during the time of Armageddon (the sixth plague) when the four winds are released there will be political strife. Nation will rise against nation. The nations of the earth will be fighting each other. Now if the people of God believe that the nations fighting each other is the four winds let loose there is absolutely no deception in that. The Middle East is the place of the greatest political tensions in the world. The nations of the Middle East are some of the most volatile on the earth. So if the nations of the Middle East are going to fight each other it is not a deception to believe that this is the four winds let loose. In fact the nations could even fight each other on the very "dusty Palestinian plain" and there would be absolutely no deception in believing that this is the four winds let loose.

Consider the following three statements:

Four mighty angels are still holding the four winds of the earth. Terrible destruction is forbidden to come in full. The accidents by land and by sea; the loss of life, steadily increasing, by storm, by tempest, by railroad disaster, by conflagration; the terrible floods, the earthquakes, and the winds will be the stirring up of the nations to one deadly combat, while the angels hold the four winds, forbidding the terrible power of Satan to be exercised in its fury until the servants of God are sealed in their foreheads. {RH, June 7, 1887 par. 13}

Everything in our world is in agitation. There are wars and rumours of wars. The nations are angry, and the time of the dead has come, that they should be judged. Events are changing to bring about the day of God, which hasteth greatly. Only a moment of time, as it were, yet remains. But while already nation is rising against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, there is not now a general engagement. As yet the four winds are held until the servants of God shall be sealed in their foreheads. Then the powers of earth will marshal their forces for the last great battle. {6T 14.1}

Four mighty angels hold back the powers of this earth till the servants of God are sealed in their foreheads. The nations of the world are eager for conflict; but they are held in check by the angels. When this restraining power is removed, there will come a time of trouble and anguish. Deadly instruments of warfare will be invented. Vessels, with their living cargo, will be entombed in the great deep. All who have not the spirit of truth will unite under the leadership of satanic agencies. But they are to be kept under control till the time shall come for the great battle of Armageddon. {7BC 967.8}

How should we understand the three preceding statements? Since the four winds represent political strife and the nations of the earth fighting each other, we can draw the following three conclusions: 1) The winds will be the stirring up of the nations to one deadly combat in which they will fight each other. 2) The powers of earth will marshal their forces to fight against each other and 3) the nations of the world are eager for conflict against each other.

The issues (and combatants) will be spiritual, not political as they are at present in the Middle East. The battle of Armageddon will pit the nations of the world against the armies of heaven...

What "weapons" would the beast and the rulers of earth employ in warfare against Christ and heaven? Will they deploy weapons of mass destruction or laser beams? The Bible doesn't say, but it's interesting to think about it. {Signs of the Times, September 2004}

The article in the Signs of the Times totally ignores the fact that at the very time of Armageddon the nations of the world will be fighting against each other as plainly

represented by the four winds. Instead they say that nations of the world will be fighting against the armies of heaven and not each other. They question how earthly nations could fight the armies of heaven perhaps with laser beams. This is ridiculous. The armies of heaven will fight as they have always done, not in a visible manner, but as the angel Gabriel fought in Daniel 10:20 "and now will I return to fight with the prince of Persia: and when I am gone forth, lo, the prince of Grecia shall come." The angels fight behind the scenes influencing nations to fight each other as Greece fought to overcome Persia.

Read Revelation 7:1-4. The seal of the living God is given to the people of God so that they can be protected when the four winds are let loose. The reason for this is so that they can be protected from the winds of political strife and war. Consider the following:

Satan is now using every device in this sealing time to keep the minds of God's people from the present truth and to cause them to waver. I saw a covering that God was drawing over His people to protect them in the time of trouble; and every soul that was decided on the truth and was pure in heart was to be covered with the covering of the Almighty. {EW 43.2}

Satan was trying his every art to hold them where they were, until the sealing was past, until the covering was drawn over God's people, and they left without a shelter from the burning wrath of God, in the seven last plagues. God has begun to draw this covering over His people, and it will soon be drawn over all who are to have a shelter in the day of slaughter. God will work in power for His people; and Satan will be permitted to work also. {EW 44.2}

The people of God will be protected from the political strife and wars of the four winds. But not only that, in Early Writings page 44 above quoted it says that the seal of God is given to protect the people of God from the burning wrath of God, in the seven last plagues. So the seal of God is given to protect the people of God from both the seven last plagues and the four winds. Since they are protected from both, again we can say the seven last plagues and the four winds are either one and the same thing, or at the very least they are events that bear a remarkable similarity.

As we have shown previously the four winds represent earthquake, tempest, political strife, famine, pestilence, sword, and nation rising against nation. That being the case can we distinguish between the earthquake and tempest of the seventh plague and the earthquake and tempest of the four winds? Can we distinguish between the incurable sores of the first plague and the pestilence of the four winds? Can we distinguish between the heat of the fourth plague which brings famine and the famine of the four winds? Can we untangle the events of the seven last plagues from those of four winds and say they are something different? Also we recognise that the four winds represent political strife and war but is there nothing to represent political strife and war in the seven last plagues?

As the people of God, we are to be prepared for the time when there will be political strife and wars at the end of the world, at the very time of Armageddon. The article in the Signs of the Times ignores these facts and is itself a dangerous piece of deception. It is a "peace and safety" message, which attempts to set people at ease in regards to any political strife and especially that which is occurring in the Middle East at the moment. *AMEN*.





Through the fall, man, who had been created in the image of God, had lost that image. Sin had all but obliterated it from his life. He had become an alien to God's kingdom, "strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world." Eph. 2:12. Gen. 3:23, 24. Sin had become man's first nature. He was unable to do good. Just as the Ethiopian is powerless to change his skin and the leopard his spots, so the sinner could not restore righteousness to his depraved soul. Death must be the dire consequence of his sin. So far as his own power was concerned, he was beyond hope.

"From the beginning, God and Christ knew of the apostasy of Satan, and of the fall of man through the deceptive power of the apostate. God did not ordain that sin should exist, but He foresaw its existence, and made provision to meet the terrible emergency." DA 22.

"Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot; Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you." 1 Pet. 1:18- 20.

"Before the foundations of the earth were laid, the Father and the Son had united in a covenant to redeem man if he should be overcome by Satan. They had clasped their hands in a solemn pledge that Christ should become the surety for the human race. This pledge Christ has fulfilled. When upon the cross He cried out, "It is finished." If Thy justice is satisfied, "I will that they also, whom Thou hast given Me, be with Me where I am." John 19:30; 17:24. DA 834, EW 149, 150.

Fountain of Life

"In that day there shall be a fountain opened to the house of David and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness." Zech. 13:1.

"Solemnly, Christ said to Peter, 'If I wash thee not, thou hast not part with Me." John 13:10. The service, which Peter refused, was the type of a higher cleansing. Christ had come to wash the heart from the stain of sin. In refusing to allow Christ to wash his feet, Peter was refusing the higher cleansing included in the lower. He was really rejecting his Lord. It is not humiliating to the Master to allow Him to work for our purification. The truest humility is to receive with thankful heart any provision made in our behalf, and with earnestness do service for Christ.

"At the words, If I wash thee not, thou hast no part with Me,' Peter surrendered his pride and self-will; he could not endure the thought of separation from Christ; that would have been death to him. 'Not my feet only,' he said, 'but also my hands and my feet.' Jesus saith to him, 'He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit.'

"These words meant more than bodily cleanliness. Christ is still speaking of the higher cleansing as illustrated by the lower. He who came from the bath was clean, but the sandaled feet soon became dusty, and again needed to be washed. So Peter and his brethren had been washed in the great fountain opened for sin and uncleanness. Christ

acknowledged them as His. But temptation had led them into evil, and they still needed His cleansing grace. When Jesus girded Himself with a towel to wash the dust from their feet, He desired by that very act to wash the alienation, jealousy, and pride from their hearts. With the spirit they then had, not one of them was prepared for communion with Christ. Until brought into a state of humility and love, they were not prepared to partake of the paschal supper, or to share in the memorial service which Christ was about to institute. Their hearts must be cleansed. Pride and self-seeking create dissention and hatred, but all this Jesus washed away in washing their feet. A change of feeling was brought about. Looking upon them, Jesus could say, 'Ye are clean.' Now there was union of heart. love for one another. They had become humble and teachable. Except Judas, each was ready to concede to another the highest place. Now with subdued and grateful hearts they could receive Christ's words.

"Like Peter and his brethren, we too have been washed in the blood of Christ, yet often through contact with evil the heart's purity is soiled. We must come to Christ for His cleansing grace. Peter shrank from bringing his soiled feet in contact with the hands of his Lord and Master; but how often we bring our sinful, polluted hearts in contact with the heart of Christ! How grievous to Him is our evil temper, our vanity and pride! Yet all our infirmity and defilement we must bring to Him. He alone can wash us clean. We are not prepared to communion with Him unless cleansed by His efficacy." DA 646.

"Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But

with the precious blood of Christ as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." 1 Pet.

1:18, 19.

Every human being; "rich and poor, high and low, free and bond, are God's heritage. He who gave His life to redeem man sees in every human being a value that exceeds finite computation. 
As the gospel was preached to the world in that first century, so in these final times God's message will go to all humanity. Are you involved in this general proclamation? Has your individual effort joined that of your brothers and sisters to complete the work of God?

May the gracious Lord forgive our sinful negligence. May the self-sacrifice, the sympathy, and the love manifested in the life of Christ reappear in the life of the worker for God. *AMEN*.

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In the epistles to the Romans and to the Corinthians, chapter 12, the apostle Paul speaks about the church of God and the gifts of the Spirit given to its members to serve the whole. He compares the members of the church to the members of the human body and says, "So we, [being] many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another." Romans 12:5. "For the body is not one member, but many." 1 Corinthians 12:14. The members are interrelated and all together form the body of Christ. Each member is given a talent or more.

"But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another [divers] kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues." 1 Corinthians 12: 7-10.

One member has the talent of spiritual vision and is the eye of the church, another has the talent of helping others in a practical way, has medical training of some kind and is the hand; the feet are surely those who go around preaching the message of salvation to the world, as Isaiah so nicely describes them, reaching inaccessible places up on the mountains, "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace; that bringeth good tidings of good, that publisheth salvation; that saith unto Zion, Thy God reigneth!" Isaiah 52:7.

Some people have more than one talent, but even he who has only one is very necessary in the church to keep the body healthy. The eye can be very important, but if something gets into the eye, we need the finger to help to take it out. One member needs the other and all work together under the direction of the head, where the brain is. The head of the church is Jesus Christ, (Ephesians 5: 23) and for the body to be healthy it must be submitted to the head.

There are several people in the church who have the same talent, in the same way that in the body there are organs that are doubled; we have two arms and hands, two feet, two ears, two eyes, two lungs, two kidneys but they work together in perfect harmony; they share the burden and the one needs and complements the other. It should be the same way in the church among people with the same talent, no rivalry, no spirit of competition, no fear that the other one may be more appreciated or considered than we because his vision is sharper, his capacity of listening is greater, he is more skilful. If we observe the human body, we know that in spite of its symmetry there are tiny little differences: one foot is a little bigger than the other, one eye sees a little better than the other one, the right hand is more skilful than the left one, but have you ever been deprived even if temporarily from the use of one of the double members of the body? Have you experienced how difficult it is to have to make use of only one leg or one arm and hand? It is a big inconvenient to the whole body. The problem is surely much more serious for those who have to live with one kidney or have a sick lung. There is room for everyone in the church of God and the more talents there are the better it is, the more service it can render.

But our human body has only one head and one heart and so does the church. Jesus Christ is the source of wisdom and love. He has the power to purify and sanctify our talents. He can make that the foot, instead of treading and stamping, may wander in search of souls for His kingdom. He sanctifies the hand so that instead of being closed

in an aggressive or mean fist, it may open to caress, to give, to help. He makes that the eye, instead of looking at the mistakes of others, be fixed upon Jesus and receives power from Him to accept everybody with his weaknesses. He heals the ears so instead of listening to bad reports, they may listen to the word of God that leads to salvation. All members are very important. "...and the eye cannot say unto the hand, I have no need of thee: nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you. Nay, much more those members of the body, which seem to be more feeble, are necessary: And those [members] of the body, which we think to be less honourable, upon these we bestow more abundant honour; and our uncomely [parts] have more abundant comeliness" 1 Corinthians 12:21-23. The Lord does not want any separation in His body, "That there should be no schism in the body; but [that] the members should have the same care one for another. And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it; or one member be honoured, all the members rejoice with it." 1 Corinthians 12:26-28.

In the church of God there should be sympathy for those who suffer and no jealousy or envy of those who are successful. If everyone understands the role he plays in the body, he will not occupy his mind with what he could have been, but try to do his best to fulfil his service to perfection, to be submitted to the head--to Christ, so that he can serve even better.

In Ephesians 4:11-13 we read, "And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ." The purpose of all these talents is the spiritual edification of the body, of the church, so that Christ may be presented to the world.

In Corinthians 12:27, 28 we read, "Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular. And God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues." The last talent mentioned is the gift of tongues. This gift was given to the apostles on the day of Pentecost and

people from many nationalities heard the message of salvation in his own language! No need of interpretation from a booth, no turning of a button to choose the language one understands the best, but an opening of the heart to the words of salvation that came from the lips of almost illiterate preachers empty of self and fully possessed by the Spirit of God.

In the church there are persons who are the tongue, and although this is a small and a single member, it has its importance within the body. Jacob says, "the tongue is a little member", but he explains how dangerous such a member can be. "And the tongue [is] a fire." Just like the fire, it can have a destructive influence and burn everything to the ground or can set hearts on fire for the truth that is in Jesus. Actually every member can be either a blessing or a curse, depending whether it is submitted to the head or not, whether it is under the guidance of the Holy Spirit or some other power is leading it. In Matthew 5:29 we read, "And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast [it] from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not [that] thy whole body should be cast into hell." It is a great privilege to be the eye in the church, a person with ample vision who can foresee things and has spiritual discernment. Usually such people occupy leading positions, but the greater the gift the more the dependence on the Gift-giver should be. And who has given us the gift we have? "But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will" 1 Corinthians 12:11. How important it is then that all members may be subject to the Head and follow the commands of the Spirit. Only thus there will be real unity and growth in love and harmony.

"But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, [even] Christ: From whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love." Ephesians 4:15, 16.

Human bodies run best on a diet rich in plant-based protein, high fibre and an abundance of fruits and vegetables. Myriad studies point to a high correlation between the typical Western diet—with large amounts of foods from animal sources—and disease.

As the evidence linking diet and health accumulates, so does the medical research examining how diet can prevent cancer or slow its growth.

A researcher quotes, "This field didn't exist until nine or ten years ago, because medicine hadn't been geared toward prevention-related research."

Researchers found a link between a high-fat diet and cancer as far back as 1942, when tumours in animals fed a high-fat diet grew more quickly than in a control group.

One researcher gives this example regarding prostate cancer specifically, "The United States and Western Europe have the highest death rates from prostate cancer and the highest per capita fat consumption. In contrast, the Pacific Rim countries with the lowest death rates from prostate cancer have the lowest fat consumption." However, he

notes that when these people move to the West, they lose their edge. Americans born in China or Japan, for example, have an incidence of prostate cancer three to seven times higher than those still living in their homelands.

"Something to do with diet is going on here," cites a Toronto-area nutrition consultant. But she says that scientists don't yet understand why. They are looking at whether fatty acids themselves contain carcinogens, whether people who eat a lot of meat consume too few fruits and vegetables (and thereby lose out on their protective effects), or whether it is that high-fat diets tend to lead to obesity, which itself carries a higher risk of cancer.

Dietary benefits may come not only from reducing fat intake, but also in eating foods rich in protective micronutrients. A study done in Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto added three micronutrients to the diets of mice. The incidence of cancer was reduced fourfold—even in the group fed a high-fat diet. These mice were put on this diet almost immediately after birth, suggesting that the later someone started a healthy diet, the smaller the beneficial effects may be. For people who want to start reducing

their risk of cancer, they need to start immediately on a diet high in soy products, fruits and vegetables, and cut down on fat and take in fewer calories.

Research suggests that we can lower our risk of getting cancer by exercising daily, limiting high-fat foods from animal sources, and eating mostly vegetables, fruits, and grains. Plant sources of food contain phytonutrients, which aren't vitamins or minerals, but have important health benefits. Phytonutrients are not available in supplement form, so it is important to eat plenty of foods which contain these cancer-fighting compounds. The following food sources, offer specific cancer-fighting benefits because of the various phytonutrients they contain:

Red fruits and vegetables such as cranberries, tomatoes, watermelon, papaya and red peppers contain lycopene, which protects damaged cells from becoming cancerous. Lycopene is a powerful antioxidant, which gives red fruits and vegetables their colour. Antioxidants neutralize free radicals, which can damage the body's cells. Research also shows that lycopene in tomatoes can be absorbed more efficiently by the body if processed into a juice or a sauce. The

heat produced in processing the tomatoes is what seems to increase its availability to the cells in the body.

In the body, lycopene is deposited into the liver, lungs, prostate gland, bladder, colon and skin. Therefore, lycopene-containing fruits and vegetables are most effective in preventing cancers in these organs. Studies show that Italians who consume large amounts of tomatoes as part of their diet had a lower incidence of digestive tract cancers. Of the red fruits and vegetables, tomatoes were the only ones that lowered the incidence of prostate cancer.

Cruciferous vegetables, such as cabbage, cauliflower, brussels sprouts and broccoli, are rich in sulphoraphanes, which help flush ingested cancer-causing compounds from the body. Sulphoraphanes are also powerful antioxidants. It is the group of sulphoraphanes that contain an extra sulfur atom that are anti-carcinogenic. Unlike tomatoes, broccoli needs to be eaten raw to get the best effects. When broccoli is chewed, it releases this chemical for the body to use. Heating broccoli in the conventional way destroys the enzyme that

produces the sulphoraphanes.

Leafy green vegetables, tofu, walnuts, canola oil, pumpkin seeds, and flaxseed contain Omega-3 fatty acids, which help maintain a healthy body and repair diseased tissues. Flaxseed has been shown to have the highest levels of omega-3 fatty acids. Flaxseed needs to be ground up, or chewed very well. If just eating whole seeds, they will pass through the body undigested and not be used. It is best to buy pre-ground seeds if possible. In addition to omega-3 fatty acids, flaxseed contains lignans, an antioxidant which also protect against various cancers. Flaxseed oil is not as beneficial as it does not contain the fibre and lignans that the actual flaxseed contains. Also, flaxseed oil breaks down with heat, so it should not be used to cook with. Ground flaxseed can be used in baking.

Not only does omega-3 fatty acids protect against cancer, but it has many health benefits in preventing heart disease, arthritis, cognitive decline, osteoporosis, diabetes, etc. Omega-3 acids are considered polyunsaturated fats, which are the healthy fats that prevent cholesterol build-up.

Vitamin E is also considered an antioxidant which can decrease the risk of cancer. It occurs naturally in plant-based fatty foods such as nuts, sunflower seeds, safflower, canola, corn and olive oils, wheat germ, leafy green vegetables, asparagus, mangoes, wheat germ and whole grains. Vitamin E also helps to counteract the effects of a high-fat diet. Although, cutting fat from the diet is more beneficial instead of using a supplement to diminish the bad effects of fat in the diet.


Garlic, leeks, and shallots contain selenium and antioxidants, and can help dispose of cancer-causing chemicals. They also protect DNA from harmful substances. These products belong to the family known as alliums. Garlic also has the added benefit of protecting the body from Choose foods made with fresh garlic instead of taking supplements, since a lot of synthesized compounds are added by manufacturers whenever garlic is chopped, crushed, or minced. After crushing fresh garlic, let it stand for 15 minutes before cooking with it—researchers have found that this activates a "cancer-fighting" enzyme within the garlic. On the other hand, roasting garlic in




unfit for a place in His work.



"'Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die' (Rev. 3:2). This is our work. There are many ready to die spiritually, and the Lord calls upon us to strengthen them. God's people are to be firm to duty. They are to be bound together by the bonds of Christian fellowship and are to be strengthened in the faith by speaking often to one another about the precious truths entrusted to them. Never are they to quarrel and condemn. They are to unite upon the importance of obedience to God's law.

"In this life there is nothing of greater importance than preparation of character that we may at last enter with joy into the saints' abode on high. Why do we not improve our privilege of being saints here below?"



SISTER WHITE'S ACCIDENT



When she was nine years old a terrible accident happened to Ellen Harmon (later, White)—something which was to change her life and work, and also the work of God in the earth.

One day, as school closed, Ellen and her sister Elizabeth hurried with the other pupils out of the schoolhouse and across the common, going home. A friend of theirs was with them. But an older girl had become angry at them for some trifle. and now she followed them, saying ugly things and calling them names. Their parents had taught them not to quarrel but to turn away from evil. So now they hurried on, not saying anything back to the girl. But when they were almost across the common Ellen turned her head to see how near the girl was. Just then that girl threw a heavy stone, and it smashed right into Ellen's face and knocked her down, senseless.

When she came to, she found herself in a nearby store, where they had carried her. People were standing around her. Her face and clothing were all covered with blood, and she felt very weak and dizzy. A kind gentleman offered to take her home in his carriage, but she did not want to get it bloody, so she said she could walk. Helped by her sister and her friend, she started to go home; but she had not gone very far when she fainted again, and Elizabeth and her friend carried her the rest of the way.

Now she did not awaken for three weeks. Everyone but her mother thought she would die, but her mother believed that God would heal her. Her father was away from home on a long business trip. When she awoke she found that the rock which had hit her had broken her nose and so changed her face that she did not look like the same girl. In fact, when her father came home, he did not know her, and asked where his little Ellen was, though she was right there.

But worst of all, when after many months she tried to go to school again, she found that she could not study. The accident had made her so ill and nervous and had hurt her sight that the print all ran together. The girl who had thrown the stone was very sorry. The teacher set her to help Ellen study, but she could not help her much; and often tears of remorse came to her eyes as she watched the little girl struggling to read.

After three years of trying, Ellen had to give up; and that was the last she went to



school. However, later, when she grew better, she gained a good education by reading and studying outside of school. The Bible was always her most beloved book, and through its study she came to be wise and true and loving, a great helper of others, and the teacher of thousands of people.

But those three years of struggle and pain were very dark days for her. No longer was she the cheery, happy girl she had been before. She thought her life was ruined, her hopes of becoming a teacher were gone, and there stretched before her a dreary road. She tried to believe in the goodness of God and to love the Lord, but she found it hard. Many nights,

while her sister Elizabeth slept, she would creep from bed and bow for hours in agonized prayer upon the cold floor.

Her mother helped her to find Jesus, the gentle, pitying Saviour. The Harmon family were Methodists; and at a Methodist camp meeting, when she was twelve years old, Ellen found the peace of God. She knew that her sins were forgiven, for Jesus' sake, and that she was a child of the King. Now once again the world was to her a beautiful and joyous place, more than ever it had been when she was little. All nature seemed to be singing, and she sang with it.

The sun shone bright and clear, and flooded the earth with light and warmth. The trees and grass were a fresher green; the sky was a deeper blue. The birds sang more sweetly than ever before; they seemed to Ellen to be praising their Creator in their songs. She was so happy she did not care to talk. But when they reached home she went out into the garden, among the flowers that her mother lovingly tended and taught her girls to tend. The garden had never before looked so lovely as it looked this day.

There was one beautiful pink flower on a shrub called the rose of Sharon. Ellen went slowly toward it, drinking in its beauty, and she touched its delicate petals reverently. Her heart overflowed with tenderness and love for these beautiful creations of God. "Ah," she thought, "if God so loves and cares for the flowers He has decked with beauty, how much more tenderly will He guard the children who are made in His image!" And she said softly to herself, "I am a child of God. His loving care is around me. I will obey Him, and never displease Him. I will praise His dear name, and love Him always."

She was taken into the Methodist

Church; and with eleven others, on a windy day, while the waves rolled in from the Atlantic Ocean and dashed high on the shores of Portland Bay, she went down into the water and was baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It was a happy day for her, the beginning of a long life of Christian service.

Still she was not well and strong, and many years were to pass before she was to be made well by the goodness of God. But even in her weakness she went forward, working for the Lord. She prayed for her young friends, and she talked with them about the Lord Jesus. And they were converted. Yet as the days and the months went by, her old temptation to doubt the goodness of God would come back upon her, and sometimes she felt very sad.

A few months after her baptism there came to Portland the great apostle and herald of the second coming of Jesus, William Miller. From the prophecies of the Bible, and especially from Daniel 8 and 9, he was teaching that a great event, "the cleansing of the sanctuary," was to take place in 1843 or 1844; and he believed that this cleansing of the sanctuary was the cleansing of the earth by fire at the last day, and that would be the coming of Christ in glory. So he preached that the end of the world was right at hand, when Jesus would reign and His blessed kingdom of peace would cover the world. He was right about the time when the sanctuary of God should

be cleansed, but he was wrong about that being the coming of Christ, for the sanctuary is not this earth; it is the temple of God in heaven. And only after it shall have been cleansed will Jesus come back to earth for the faithful.

However, thousands of people believed and looked for the Lord to come on October 22, 1844. Among these believers in Portland were the Harmon family. Ellen was very happy over this hope to see her Saviour so soon, and to have all the troubles and pains of this life come to an end. Believers in the Second Advent were found in all the churches. But after a while their churches turned against them, and told them that either to stop believing in what William Miller taught, or else be cast out. The Harmon family, with many others, held to their faith, and so they were cast out from the Methodist Church. After that, the Adventists, as they had come to be called, met together, week after week, in a city hall.

Ellen was sixteen years old when the great day of their hope came. She had been a real Christian worker, whose bright experience and words of cheer were welcomed in all the churches before the Adventists were cast out, and afterward still among the believers.

But on the

great day, October 22, when they expected their Lord to come, He did not come. Oh, how deep was their disappointment! It was as great as the disappointment of Jesus' disciples when He was crucified on Calvary. Those disciples had expected Him to become king of Israel, and instead He was nailed to the cross, crucified between two thieves. Now the Adventists expected Him to come in glory, but He did not come. They did not know then that He had fulfilled the prophecy, and had entered into the most holy place of the sanctuary in heaven, to cleanse it of the forgiven sins of His people. This they were soon to learn. But now they were bowed down, crushed in their disappointment.

The girl Ellen, with all the rest, was disappointed. But her hope held firm that in due time Jesus would come, and that very soon He would explain to His people what their disappointment meant. She did not yet know that she was Jesus' messenger, to carry the good news to the people. But she was.
